1. Introduction of those attending

2. Brief presentation of the "chair-elect" Kevin Roedl

Kevin Roedl presented himself with a short PPT presentation. Kevin Roedl will be the chairin-elect for the period 10/23-10/24 after which he will be the chair.

3. Presentation of TEM activities 2023

Markus Skrifvars presented the TEM activities of 2023. The main events have been a webinar in January and a podcast in June. In addition, the Trauma eLearning material has been updated in January 2023. The LIVES 2023 program has been prepared.

4. Rapport from the TEM research group

The TEM Research group had been compiled after an email was sent out to all TEM members. One Zoom was held in October 2023. The following plans have been discussed and are underway.

A survey of the use of eCPR in Europe. Kevin Roedl has prepared a survey which has been reviewed by some of those attending the Zoom call. In addition, the survey will be sent to Jan Belohlavek and Fabio Taccone. The plan is to aim to include one local PI in each European country who will distribute to all eCPR hospitals in a given country.

In addition, the question of US used in CPR has been discussed. To get more information about this practice a survey could also be an option.

5. Topics for LIVES 2024

- A Ukranian colleague was in touch about a session on military medicine. This could be a session with speakers from Ukraine, Israel and a European country.
- Care of the "special case" in the "rural" hospital? This could include a burned patient or a pediatric patient.
- Extreme weather cases? This could include heat stroke, accidental hypothermia and refugee cases.
- Toxicology?
- Long-term outcomes after emergency care?

6. Other issues

- Martin Dunser raised the issue of the care of critically ill patients in the emergency department. The practice is likely to vary greatly between European countries. This could also be a nice survey to reveal the practice at the present. In addition, we could do a "point prevalence" survey on the care of the critically ill in the ED.
- The TEM will need new representatives for the Social Media committee and the E-learning committee. Lina Grauslyte was happy to continue on the eLearning committee. For the new representative for the Social Media committee, the meeting opted for Tommaso Scquizzato.
- The issue of an eLearning material for "post-cardiac arrest care" was discussed.
 Markus Skrifvars will contact Theresa Olasveengen who showed interest in this in the past.
- The eLearning material needs an annual check-up. Markus and Claudio will liaise with the ones involved in the last round. We will need new people. Martin Dunser is happy to look at the toxicology material. Lennart Peters from Germany and Vassilios Kaldis from Greece are happy to look at the trauma materials.
