- Executive Committee (EC) Victoria Metaxa:
 - Each ESICM member can now be affiliated to two sections. All, to promote the ETH Section and increase membership
 - Creation of Section Boards, which will include the Chair/ Chair Elect, the Section representatives to ESICM committees and an EC board member. For the ETH section is Peter (Vernon) van Heerden (petervanheerden54@gmail.com) and he will be the point of contact for any questions, ideas or support.
 - Creation of Section-related WhatsApp group. A member from the Section Board will be the WhatsApp Community admin, responsible for managing interactions within the group through admin settings. Among the 14 awards this year, none were linked to ethics – we discussed the opportunity to apply for the upcoming ESICM Family Partnership Grant or the Global ICU Grant – each of these grants is worth €20,000, and that needs to be considered in the applications.

Academy Sub Committee - <u>Diogo da Costa Oliveira</u>

We discussed the new structure of Education and Training Committee (ETC) in ESICM (see figure).

- The ACE Academy has 6 courses/ e-modules (8% of total) on ethics, which we revise each year. They will have to be reviewed and maybe incorporated in the new structure.


