- Multicenter retrospective data collection, exploring the tier three therapies used in case of refractory intracranial hypertension. Status: center recruitment closed

### **Ongoing prospective observational studies**

- ENIO study: published on ICM. Ongoing sub-studies. Prof Cinotti
- SYNAPSE- ICU study: published in 2021, ongoing sub-studies. Prof Citerio
- SANDMAN: Sedation and analgesia in neurocritically ill patients. Prof S Mehta and Dr Lara Prisco.
- Eureca study: epidemiology and outcomes of patients admitted to the ICU with allcause meningo-encephalitis. Prof Romain Sonneville. Manuscript published on ICM
- Ventibrain: mechanical ventilation practice in acute brain injured patients. Prof Chiara Robba. Recruitment closed

### Ongoing prospective randomized clinical trials (RCTs)

- Train: randomized controlled trial on Hb targets. Prof Fabio Taccone. Recruitment closed
- BIKe: randomized controlled trial on safety and efficacy of ketamine in brain injured patients. Prof Geert Meyfroidt. Recruitment ongoing.

# New proposals:

- Compose study: Observational study to establish the natural history of recovery from coma. Prof Helbok
- ECMO-BRAIN: Observational study on neuromonitoring during ECMO. Prof Sonneville
- LIMIT-TBI study. Randomized controlled trial on fluid balance in acute brain injured patients. Prof Mathieu Van der Jagt. Feasibility study submitted to the Ethical committee approval
