- Critical care outside the ICU
- What can the ED/ICU learn from pre-hospital setting and teams?
- Ultrasound uses in the ED
- One session should be a session on trauma and for the planning of this Tobias Gauss can be consulted concerning both topics and speakers

5. ACE Trauma Module needs to be updated

Lina Grauslyte mentioned the need to update the ACE Trauma module. Tobias Gauss reported that he has compiled a team and the plan is to rewrite the whole module. Lina will send details about the process and requirements to Tobias. Six months is the expected timeline for this. Other TEM members can take part in the process for example as reviewers of the written material.

6. Other business

The TEM is likely to be asked to arrange a Webinar. Possible topics for this could be war medicine or trauma care in general. Martin Dunser suggested "The care for the critically ill patient in the ED", but there will be a debate about this at LIVES 2024.

There is a survey being planned on eCPR by Markus Skrifvars and Kevin Roedl. This can also involve the ELSO network. Markus Skrifvars and Kevin Roedl will liaise with Jan Belohlavek and Fabio Taccone. There was a suggestion to also include the use of uncontrolled organ donation in the survey.
