I am a Consultant in Anaesthesia & Intensive Care Medicine within Barts Health, the largest NHS Trust in the United Kingdom. I work principally in one of the the biggest cardiovascular centre in Europe but maintain a broad spectrum of practice across our sister hospitals including major trauma, ENT and vascular surgery. I have a keen interest in echocardiography and am accredited in trans-oesophageal and trans-thoracic scanning. I am a mentor for these with the European Society of Cardiovascular Imaging as well as for the European Diploma of Echocardiography run by ESICM. We are also an ECMO unit with a burgeoning workload of mechanical circulatory support reflecting the high incidence of coronary disease and expertise as one of the largest cardiomyopathy centres in the world. I have been involved with ESICM as a member of the NEXT committee and am currently a member of the Clinical Training committee.
