5. Presentation of TEM activities 2025

The TEM section has met twice this year. At the ISICEM meeting in Brussels in March 2025 and now at LIVES 2025 in Munich.

The TEM Section prepared the programme for the ESICM LIVES 2025 congress in Munich including all separate TEM areas. The topics for the programme of LIVES 2025 were chosen and discussed based on the input from TEM members proposed during meetings and via e-mail exchange. The programme was finally prepared by Kevin Roedl.

Speakers were mainly selected from European countries. Great effort was made to ensure a geography balanced as well as gender balanced programme for the congress.

The TEM Section will organize a podcast in October/November 2025 about the newly released ERC/ESICM Post-Resuscitation Care Guidelines. Claudio Sandroni, Markus Skrifvars, Tommaso Scquizzato and Kevin Roedl will participate in the podcast for the TEM section.

A revision process for the TEM ESICM ACE modules on Trauma was done and lead by Tobias Gauss.

6. Presentation of TEM activities during the LIVES 2025 congress

Short presentation of the activities during this year's congress. There are 7 Abstract sessions. A case based essential on the Patient journey in trauma care. 3 Video on demand lectures. Overall, 5 Thematic sessions (1 joint with HRSO and Ethics Section / 1 Joint with ERC). Further 2 Debates will be held during the congress.

7. Introducing the new chair elect Luca Carenzo, Milan, Italy

Luca Carenzo is the new TEM Chair elect and gave a short introduction about himself and his vision for TEM.

8. Brief report from the TEM Burns Group

Kathryn Puxty held a brief report on the TEM Burns Group. This group is dedicated to "Burns and burn related injuries" and is led by Kathryn Puxty & François Dépret. Regarding scientific activities a short communication for the "What's new" section of Intensive Care Medicine has been submitted. Furthermore, a manuscript regarding cardiac arrest in patients with major burns is currently prepared.

9. Brief report from the TEM Intoxication Group

Christoph Hüser held a brief report on the TEM Intoxication Group. This group is dedicated to "Intoxications" and is led by Bruno Megarbane & Christoph Hüser. The group wrote a review entitled "Critical Care Management of the Patient with Pharmaceutical Poisoning", which was accepted for publication in Intensive Care Medicine in October 2025. Further manuscripts are in preparation.

10. Research activities

Several TEM section members were involved in the development of the ERC/ESICM Guidelines on Post cardiac arrest care which were recently released in October 2025. Furthermore, it was possible to have one dedicated session on the new guidelines at the ESICM Lives 2025 congress in Munich.

Meetings on research activities have been held two times a year. A small group of TEM members has been formed that can collaborate on TEM-endorsed scientific activities. Thus far there appears to be projects that are moving forward: A survey involving all

European countries on the practice and state of extracorporeal life support in the setting of cardiac arrest. A preliminary survey has been drafted and will be finalized and rolled out by end of 2025. This will result in a scientific publication in 2026. An effort will be made to find collaborators from other ESICM sections.

Further, research projects and also the opportunity for position statements and guidelines were discussed.
