## Comments

I would be honoured to serve as Chairperson of the CoBaTrICE Subcommittee. I bring sustained engagement with ESICM education, research, and curriculum development, with a particular focus on competency-based training in Intensive Care Medicine.

In addition to the information provided above, I have been actively engaged with ESICM, especially with CoBaTrICE, for several years. I have actively been involved with CoBaTrICE curriculum revision process, where I led the revision of the Rehabilitation domain. I remain to serve as an active member of FREM section and the Rehabilitation Section and have contributed to ESICM–endorsed research, including serving on the Steering Committees for the COSMIGI and GUTPHOS studies within the FREM section. My experience as an EDIC examiner since 2022 and EDIC Centre Director in Brussels since 2025 has strengthened my understanding of assessment systems and the alignment between curriculum design, delivery, and evaluation. I have also contributed to UK National Curriculum development in focused acute medical ultrasound and undergraduate education, alongside editorial work (Section Editor) on GPICS v3, reflecting my engagement with quality standards in intensive care education.

If elected, I would focus on strengthening the coherence and flexibility of the CoBaTrICE curriculum, enhancing alignment with EDIC, fostering collaboration across ESICM sections, and supporting faculty development. I am committed to ensuring a robust, evidence–based, and forward–looking competency framework that supports the next generation of intensive care physicians across Europe.

## **Details on your candidature**

My educational and professional experience closely aligns with the strategic priorities of the European Society of Intensive Care Medicine (ESICM) and the CoBaTrICE programme, with strength in curriculum development, assessment, and multidisciplinary education. My engagement with ESICM has been sustained and progressive. As an active member of CoBaTrICE (since 2021), I made substantial contributions to the recent curriculum revision published in Intensive Care Medicine and continue to support its development, including leading the redevelopment of the rehabilitation section. This work has given me detailed insight into CoBaTrICE’s competency–based framework and its role in harmonising intensive care training across Europe. I have served as an EDIC Examiner since 2023 and am currently an EDIC Centre Director in Brussels (since 2024), contributing to the delivery and quality assurance of European–level assessment.

In my academic leadership roles at Keele University School of Medicine, I have held progressively senior leadership roles, including Director of the Undergraduate Ultrasound Curriculum (since 2022), Director of Clinical Skills (since 2025), and Deputy Hospital Dean (since 2026). I lead the Procedural Skills Programme and have designed and implemented a longitudinal point–of–care ultrasound curriculum supported by external grant funding. I am also a founding member of the Acute Medical Ultrasound Training Committee (Since 2015), contributing to the national implementation of the FAMUS curriculum within UK training pathways.

Nationally, I continue to contribute to intensive care education through the Faculty of Intensive Care Medicine and the Royal College of Anaesthetists, including roles on the

National Education Subcommittee, as Co-Lead for Educational Events, and as an FICM Examiner. I have also led and delivered national critical care courses and FFICM examination preparation programmes.

My role as Consultant in Critical Care and Acute Medicine underpins my educational activity, alongside leadership positions in critical care rehabilitation, sepsis strategy, and higher monitoring services. I remain academically active through clinical research, international collaborations, and authorship of peer-reviewed work, including contributions to ESICM-led research within the FREM section.

Overall, I bring sustained leadership and expertise in curriculum development, assessment, and educational innovation across local, national, and European contexts, with a strong ongoing commitment to ESICM and the continued evolution of CoBaTrICE.
