Details on your candidature

I am an Associate Professor in Anaesthesia and Intensive Care at the University of Brescia (Department of Medical and Surgical Specialties, Radiological Sciences and Public Health) and a consultant intensivist at ASST Spedali Civili di Brescia (Department of Emergency). My clinical, academic and research activities are fully dedicated to Intensive Care Medicine, in line with the prerequisites for ESICM leadership positions.

My academic role is strongly focused on education and curriculum development. I am actively involved in undergraduate and postgraduate teaching, including final-year medical student training in anaesthesia and intensive care. I currently serve as Director of two postgraduate Master programmes: one in Paediatric Anaesthesia and Intensive Care, and one in Vascular Access Nursing. These roles require the design, implementation and continuous evaluation of structured curricula, definition of learning objectives, and alignment with competency-based frameworks. This experience directly reflects the requirements of the CoBaTrICE & Curriculum Development Sub-Committee, particularly in relation to curriculum design and the development of competency-based training pathways.

At the European level, I am actively involved in ESICM activities. I am a member of the ESICM Academy EPA programme and contribute to the Faculty of the FREM section, where I am responsible for educational activities. In addition, I serve as co-lead for research within the PICS & Rehabilitation section. These roles have strengthened my experience in coordinating multidisciplinary teams, contributing to educational strategy, and integrating research and training priorities across ESICM structures.

My research activity includes more than 70 peer-reviewed publications in international journals, with a primary focus on Post-Intensive Care Syndrome (PICS) and ICU-acquired weakness (ICUAW). I have recently coordinated a Horizon Europe proposal involving a consortium of eight European institutions, further consolidating my experience in international collaboration, project management, and strategic alignment across healthcare and academic stakeholders.

My experience aligns closely with the key responsibilities of the position. I have substantial expertise in developing and implementing training programmes, defining educational objectives, and ensuring coherence between clinical practice, education and research. I am familiar with the challenges of harmonising curricula across different institutional and national contexts, and I have demonstrated the ability to work within complex organisational frameworks.

If appointed, I would envisage the role as an opportunity to further strengthen the CoBaTrICE curriculum as a dynamic, competency-based framework aligned with evolving clinical practice and educational methodologies. A key priority would be the integration of Entrustable Professional Activities (EPAs) across training pathways, ensuring clearer links between competencies, assessment strategies, and certification processes (including EDIC

and related programmes). I would also aim to enhance alignment between the ESICM educational offer and the core curriculum, promoting a structured and transparent mapping of courses and learning opportunities.

Specific projects I would prioritise include: (1) a structured revision and update of the CoBaTrICE curriculum incorporating EPAs and modern competency-based assessment tools; (2) the development of a European-level framework for benchmarking and harmonising national training programmes; and (3) the implementation of digital tools to support curriculum mapping, learner progression tracking, and integration with ESICM educational platforms.

In addition, I would foster strong collaboration with related ESICM bodies (EDIC, EDEC, Academy, and relevant sub-committees) to ensure coherence across all educational and certification activities. My goal would be to contribute to a more integrated, transparent and future-oriented European training ecosystem in Intensive Care Medicine.

I am committed to dedicating the necessary time and leadership to this role and to contributing to ESICM's mission of advancing high-quality education and training in Intensive Care Medicine across Europe.
